Over the next year, he will be writing, curating, and testing a collection of Quaker Learning Queries to eventually publish as a deck of cards. He anticipates that listening to responses will help him evaluate the depth of the young people's understanding of Quakerism. The process will also engage their minds and help them internalize why they might look forward to be practicing Quakers as adults.

***Examples of learning queries include:***

- *If you and your friends couldn't agree on what game to play, how would you decide what to do? (for ages 6-12)*
- *What does living a life of simplicity mean to you, and how does it shape your daily choices? (for teens)*

#### **Sessions Visioning Conversations for Parents**


