Data proves that together these eight policies can decrease police violence by 72%.



Campaign Zero

Many mayors and police departments around the country are announcing their endorsement of the <u>"8 Can't</u> <u>Wait" national online campaign</u>, which seeks to limit and control how police use force. Cities and towns are starting to adopt policies to ensure the following:

- 1. Officers de-escalate situations before using force
- 2. Police departments have a "Force Continuum or Matrix" included in their use of force policy, defining weapons/types of force used to respond to specific types of resistance
- 3. Officers to give verbal warning before using deadly force
- 4. Policies explicitly prohibit chokeholds and strangleholds or limit these tactics in situations where deadly force is authorized
- 5. Officers are prohibited from shooting at people in moving vehicles unless person is a deadly threat
- 6. Officers must exhaust all other reasonable alternatives before using deadly force
- 7. Officers must intervene to stop another officer from using excessive force
- 8. Officers must report all uses of force, including threatening a civilian with a firearm

According to Campaign Zero, which launched the initiative, these 8 policies, if implemented together, can decrease police violence by up to 72%, based on their <u>2016 Police Use of Force Policy Analysis</u>.
